About the course

This course will allow Lead Adult Care Workers to make a positive difference to lives of the people they support. You will be working in a frontline role such as Care Officer, Care Supervisor, Senior Care Worker, Supervising Care Worker, Senior Support Worker. These could all specialise in a variety of areas such as learning disability, mental health, drug and alcohol misuse, homecare, dementia and end-of-life care.

Undertaking this course will enable the Lead Adult Care Worker to make a positive difference to someone's life when they are faced with physical, practical, social, emotional or intellectual challenges. They will be expected to exercise judgement and take appropriate action to support individuals to maintain their independence, dignity and control. By providing leadership, guidance and direction at the frontline of care delivery they will be instrumental in improving the health and wellbeing of those receiving care and support.

The Lead Adult Care Worker will develop skills and knowledge to promote the health and wellbeing of all the people they support, whilst ensuring compliance with legislation, policies and strategies at national, local and setting based level. They will develop their values, skills and behaviours to deliver excellent support, demonstrating care and compassion. The Lead Adult Care Worker will be undertaking a rewarding, fulfilling and worthwhile role that could lead to excellent career progression within the industry.

With a duration of 12 months, you will receive online training and face to face support from our assessor.
